



### **Day 1: God Uses the Unlikely**

#### **Reading: Joshua 2:1-21**

Devotional: Rahab's story reminds us that God can use anyone for His purposes, regardless of their past. Despite her profession as a harlot, Rahab's faith in the God of Israel led her to protect the spies and ultimately play a crucial role in God's plan of redemption. Reflect on how God has worked in your own life, using your weaknesses or past mistakes for His glory. How might God be calling you to step out in faith today, even if you feel unworthy or ill-equipped? Remember, God's power is made perfect in our weakness (2 Corinthians 12:9).

### **Day 2: Faith in Action**

#### **Reading: Hebrews 11:1-6, 31**

Devotional: Hebrews 11, often called the "Hall of Faith," celebrates those who acted on their beliefs. Rahab's inclusion in this chapter underscores the power of faith-driven action. Her conviction that the God of Israel was the one true God led her to risk everything to aid His people. Consider areas in your life where your actions may not align with your professed beliefs. How can you live out your faith more boldly today? Remember, "faith by itself, if it is not accompanied by action, is dead" (James 2:17).

### **Day 3: God's Redemptive Plan**

#### **Reading: Matthew 1:1-17**

Devotional: The genealogy of Jesus includes Rahab, a former prostitute from Jericho. This inclusion beautifully illustrates God's redemptive work throughout history, using imperfect people to bring about His perfect plan. Reflect on how God has woven your story into His

greater narrative of redemption. How does knowing you're part of God's grand plan change your perspective on your daily life and choices? Thank God for His intricate, sovereign work in human history and in your personal story.

#### **Day 4: Hope in God's Promises**

##### **Reading: Joshua 6:22-25**

Devotional: God kept His promise to Rahab, saving her and her family when Jericho fell. This fulfillment of promise reminds us of God's faithfulness. Even in uncertain or challenging times, we can trust in God's unwavering commitment to His word. What promises of God do you need to cling to today? How can you cultivate hope in your life, anchoring yourself to the trustworthiness of God's character? Remember, "For no matter how many promises God has made, they are 'Yes' in Christ" (2 Corinthians 1:20).

#### **Day 5: God's Presence in Our Journey**

##### **Reading: Deuteronomy 31:6-8**

Devotional: As the Israelites prepared to enter the Promised Land, Moses reminded them of God's constant presence. Similarly, Rahab recognized God's power and presence in the Israelites' journey. In our own lives, we can take comfort in knowing that God goes before us, preparing the way and working even when we can't see it. Reflect on times when you've experienced God's guidance or felt His presence in difficult circumstances. How can you cultivate a greater awareness of God's presence in your daily life? Take time to thank God for His faithful companionship on your journey of faith.
