



Day 1: Walking Faithfully with God

Reading: Genesis 5:21-24, Hebrews 11:5-6

Devotional: Enoch's life teaches us the profound importance of walking faithfully with God. In a world filled with distractions and temptations, Enoch stood out by consistently choosing to align his life with God's will. Today, reflect on your own walk with God. Are you consistently seeking His presence and guidance in your daily life? Remember, faith isn't about perfection, but about persistent trust and obedience. Like Enoch, aim to leave a legacy of faithfulness that impacts generations to come. Ask God to strengthen your resolve to walk closely with Him, no matter the circumstances you face.

Day 2: The Sovereignty of God in Our Lives

Reading: Psalm 139:1-18, Romans 8:28-30

Devotional: The story of Enoch reminds us of God's sovereignty over our lives, including the span of our days. While we may not live for hundreds of years like the patriarchs, every day we have is a gift from God. Meditate on how God's sovereignty brings comfort and purpose to your life. Day 3: Endurance in Faith

Reading: James 1:2-12, Hebrews 12:1-3

Devotional: Enoch's 365-year walk with God exemplifies extraordinary endurance in faith. While our lifespans are shorter, the principle remains: our faith journey is a marathon, not a sprint. Consider the challenges you're facing in your spiritual walk. How can you cultivate endurance in your faith? Remember that small, consistent acts of faithfulness over time build a strong spiritual foundation. Ask God for the strength to persevere, especially when you feel weary or discouraged. Fix your eyes on Jesus, the author and perfecter of your faith, who will sustain you through every trial.

Day 4: Faithful Amidst Fallenness

Reading: 2 Peter 2:4-9, Jude 1:14-16

Devotional: Enoch lived in a time of increasing wickedness, yet remained faithful to God. In our own era, we too may feel surrounded by moral decay and spiritual darkness. How can you maintain your faith and integrity in a world that often opposes godly values? Reflect on ways you can be a light in your community, workplace, or family. Pray for discernment to recognize and resist the influences that could compromise your walk with God. Remember that God provides the strength and wisdom to live righteously, even in challenging times.

Day 5: The Promise of Eternity

Reading: 1 Thessalonians 4:13-18, Revelation 21:1-7

Devotional: Enoch's mysterious departure from earth foreshadows the glorious future awaiting believers. Just as Enoch was taken up to be with God, we too have the promise of eternal life with our Creator. How does the hope of eternity impact your daily life and decisions? Let this promise fuel your passion for God and compassion for others who need to hear the gospel. As you face life's trials, remember that they are temporary in light of eternity. Thank God for the gift of salvation through Jesus Christ and the assurance of a future free from pain, sorrow, and death. Live today with eternity in mind, eagerly anticipating the day when faith becomes sight.
